the ECHO model

The overarching goal of Project ECHO is to democratize medical knowledge to get best-practice care to underserved populations all over the world. This is accomplished through the delivery of virtual, *teleECHO* sessions that connect a team of subject matter experts with primary care providers in rural and underserved areas to discuss case-based, best-practice care.

The result? Patient's get the right care, at the right time, from providers they know and trust.

The ECHO model is not “telemedicine” where the specialist assumes care of the patient, but instead a guided practice model where the participating clinician retains responsibility for managing the patient, operating with increasing independence as their skills and self-efficacy grow.

Participation in any ECHO program is provided at no cost and free CME is available in most programs.

behavioral health integration ECHO

16 week program | financial bonuses provided to clinics enrolled in value-based contracts with Care1st

The ASU Behavioral Health Integration ECHO provides training in management strategies for developing and sustaining the integration of behavioral health specialists (psychologists, social workers, family therapists, etc.) into the primary care setting.

liver disease ECHO

hosted by Mayo Clinic – Phoenix | meets biweekly | Tuesday's @ noon | free CME credit (1 per session)

Access to information surrounding liver disease is rare in our region. Excluding liver transplant centers, the majority of patients receive care from a doctor without the proper knowledge or expertise. Patients living further from a specialized liver disease center are at a higher risk of death than those that are a closer to the expert care. Integrating the care of liver disease patients into the primary care setting will not only reduce the burden on the specialists, but will allow for better access to improved care for those that are unable to travel to their closest tertiary care provider.

medication-assisted treatment ECHO

ASU ECHO, Blue Cross Blue Shield's Mobilize AZ program, Honor Health, and ASU's Center for Applied Behavioral Health have partnered to deliver the Medication-Assisted Treatment ECHO program. The Veterans Health Administration (VHA) is the largest integrated health care system in the U.S., serving approximately nine million Veterans each year. In response to concerns about timely access to care for Veterans, Congress passed the VA MISSION Act of 2018. This legislation streamlined the Veterans Community Care Program which gives Veterans greater access to non-VHA providers in the community. With an increasing number of community providers joining this program, we seek to provide clinicians with education, support and resources on military culture and the unique considerations of providing care for the Veteran population.
